AGE : From 13 to 18 years old on arrival.

LENGTH :Term, Semester, Academic Year.

TYPE OF SCHOOL : Public (**program only open to EU students**).

LOCATION : Dublin, Killarney, Cork and Tralee.

APPLICATION DEADLINE : March 31st for arrival in August, October 31st for arrival in January. Late applications may be accepted, depending on availability.

ACCOMMODATION : Host family, full board.

SCHOOL EXPERIENCE

Students have a choice of public school placements in :

- **Dublin** : 5 voluntary secondary schools on offer (3 single sex schools & 2 mixed sex schools) located in the South of Dublin ;
- **Killarney, Cork and Tralee** : various local community schools on offer, single sex and mixed.

A donation is paid to most of the schools but these schools are not private Colleges. All schools require uniforms and many schools were founded by religious orders, but welcome students of all faiths. A typical school day begins at 9am and ends around 3.45pm. There are 8 classes per day with one short break. Extracurricular activities vary from school to school but usually sports activities are provided. Students may also join local clubs for sports and activities e.g Football, Basketball, Judo, Dance and Music. Students will be hosted in local host families. Classes begin early September and finish early June.

SCHOOL SYSTEM

There are 3 distinct levels of education in Ireland : primary, secondary and higher education. Most students attend and complete secondary education. Secondary education is generally completed at a community school, a comprehensive school, a vocational school or a voluntary secondary school. A typical secondary school will consist of 1st to 3rd Year, the usually optional Transition Year (< 16 Y.O.), the 5th (16/17 Y.O.) and 6th Year (> 17 Y.O.). Following a face-to-face interview, school principals make the ultimate decision on the appropriate class for any student. Art, Biology, Business, Chemistry, English, Economics, French, German, Geography, History, Home Economics, Mathematics, Music, Physics, Religion, Computers and Physical Education courses are usually offered. Some schools offer extra English classes to international students.

ARRIVAL AND ORIENTATION

Transfer from Dublin/Cork/Shannon airport to the host family. Local orientation provided upon arrival at destination.

REQUIREMENTS

Students must be interviewed in their home country before being accepted.

A minimum of 2 years of English study and good academic results are required.

HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS



AGE : From 13 to 18 years old (on arrival)

LENGTH : Term, Semester, Academic Year.

TYPE OF SCHOOL :

Private (**program open to EU and non EU students**).

LOCATION : Cavan and Monaghan **NEW !**.

APPLICATION DEADLIN : March 31st for arrival in August, October 31st for arrival in January. Late applications may be accepted, depending on availability and visa delays.

ACCOMMODATION : Host family, full board.

SCHOOL EXPERIENCE Students will be placed in two private schools.

Cavan : the school is a Christian co-educational boarding school under Protestant management, which has been created in 1611; it offers all needed school facilities. This is a relatively small school, with 200 students, including both day and boarding pupils. The school is located in Cavan, a small town in the North of Ireland close to Northern Ireland. Extra activities, like clubs and sports, indoor and outdoor, are organized by the school. Note that all overseas students receive ESL (English as a second language) classes during their time studying in this school.

Monaghan NEW ! : the school is a co-educational secondary school under Protestant management. This is a small school with approximately 240 students, established in 1570. The school is located in Monaghan, a small town of the North of Ireland close to the border with Northern Ireland. Pupils are actively encouraged to take part in the wide variety of optional sports ; Badminton, Basketball, Table-Tennis, Horse riding, Tennis, Soccer and Rugby are played competitively. Students will be hosted in local host families.

SCHOOL SYSTEM

There are 3 distinct levels of education in Ireland: primary, secondary and higher education. Most students attend and complete secondary education. Secondary education is generally completed at a community school, a comprehensive school, a vocational school or a voluntary secondary school. A typical secondary school will consist of 1st to 3rd Year, the usually optional Transition Year (< 16 Y.O.), the 5th (16/17 Y.O.) and 6th Year (> 17 Y.O.). The school principal will make the ultimate decision on the appropriate class for any student following a face-to-face interview. The schools offer more than 30 subjects to study, depending on the grade in which the student is placed. Classes begin early September and finish early June.

ARRIVAL AND ORIENTATION

Transfer from Dublin airport to the host family.

An orientation program is provided on location by the local coordinator.

REQUIREMENTS

Students must be interviewed in their home country before being accepted.

A minimum of 2 years of English study and good academic results are required.
